We entered the second quarter of 2024 with a series of programmes at the Sushma Swaraj Institute of Foreign Service (SSIFS). On the Foreign Vertical, the Institute held the 71<sup>st</sup> edition of its Flagship programme, the "Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats" with participation of 34 diplomats from 30 countries. In addition, the Institute welcomed 29 diplomats from Cambodia and Madagascar for their 1<sup>st</sup> ever Special Course. Similarly, the Institute organised the 2<sup>nd</sup> Special Course for 15 diplomats from the Lao PDR and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Special Course for 21 diplomats from The Gambia. A delegation from Diplomatic Correspondents Association of Bangladesh (DCAB) also visited the Institute.

On the Internal Training Vertical, the Institute's focus was on completion of the Induction Training Programme (ITP) of the 2023 batch of the Indian Foreign Service (IFS) Officer Trainees (OTs) and the two Bhutanese Diplomats. The OTs attended a technology module at Carnegie India. They also undertook attachments at the Parliamentary Research and Training Institute for Democracies (PRIDE); the External Publicity and Public Diplomacy and Protocol Divisions of MEA; and at the National Disaster Management Authority & the Coalition of Disaster Resilient Infrastructure Headquarters. The OTs also underwent their traditional Army and Air Attachments as well as deployments with select Indian Missions abroad.

External Affairs Minister, Dr. S. Jaishankar congratulated the OTs at their Valedictory Ceremony in the presence of Minister of State, Dr. Rajkumar Ranjan Singh and Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra. Meritorious officers were awarded the Medals in the respective categories.

The IFS Officers of the 2008 Batch joined the SSIFS for their Mid-Career Training Programme. The Institute also conducted a training programme for Defence Attachés who have been posted to Indian Missions abroad.

The Institute conducted both promotion related and domain based training programmes for MEA Staff members with 93 officials joining the programmes in-person and another 72 officials in virtual format from Missions abroad.

We at the Institute convey our hearty congratulations to the IFS OTs of the 2023 Batch and two Bhutanese colleagues on successful completion of their Induction Training Programme at SSIFS and wish them well in their future endeavors.
